## COURSE OBJECTIVES

## Students will....

1. Play a varied repertoire of music on their instrument of choice.
2. Apply understanding of musical concepts and demonstrate mastery through rehearsals and individual assessment.
3. Listen, analyze, describe, and evaluate musical performances.
4. Demonstrate appropriate rehearsal skills.
5. Demonstrate understanding of relationships between music, other fine arts, and disciplines outside the arts.
6. Demonstrate performance skills by giving concerts.
7. Read, write, and recognize musical notation, symbols, and language.
8. Develop social skills, critical thinking, problem solving, and teamwork.

## REHEARSAL AND BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

1. Be on time to all rehearsals and performances. Remember: Early is on time, on time is late. Rehearsal will begin three minutes after the official start time of the class, allowing students time to unpack and go to their seats.
2. Warm up appropriately on the music Ms. Foster has assigned.
3. Participate in rehearsal in an active, engaged, and meaningful way and with a positive attitude.
4. Students should avoid the following in the Band room: food, gum, candy, beverages other than water, cell phones, non-musical materials/other homework. Water in a sealed bottle is permitted.
5. Students are expected to practice regularly and prepare individual parts outside of class. Weekly private lessons are strongly encouraged!
6. Students are expected to treat teachers, students, peers, and all musical instruments and equipment with care and respect. Put all materials away in their proper place.
7. When the director or other instructor steps on the podium or asks for your attention, all playing and talking stops.
8. Students must bring their instruments and supplies necessary for class every single day. Students must bring their school chromebook every day.

Failure to follow these guidelines will result in a 0\% Rehearsal Skills grade for the day.

## REQUIRED EVERYDAY MATERIALS

1. Sharpened pencil
2. Instrument (including $3+$ reeds, accessories)
3. Music binder (including concert music, handouts, and book)
4. Chromebook
5. (Tuners and metronomes (or equivalent phone apps) are strongly recommended!)

Essential Elements is the required book for Band and is purchased through Band fees. Many instrument supplies and accessories will be sold at the "Band Store" in the director's office. Required supplies for each instrument are posted on the WHMS Band website. Failure to bring materials to class will result in a $0 \%$ for Rehearsal Skills grade for the day.

## ASSESSMENT METHODS

Mrs. Foster and other specialized instructors will assess, evaluate, and provide constructive and productive feedback for students regularly through a variety of methods. These will include, but are not limited to performances, written or electronic quizzes, written reflections, and playing assessments ("Pass-Offs.")

## GRADING POLICY

~40\% Combined Daily Demonstration of Rehearsal Skills
~25\% Concerts/Tests
~20\% Quizzes/Pass-Offs
~15\% Classwork/Homework

Gades will be posted regularly on Infinite Campus.
Participation will be tallied every week. (Example: if a student loses one day of Rehearsal Skills points, that will result in an $80 \%$ for the week.)

The HCSD will continue its practice of providing an alternative reading assignment at parent/guardian request.

## CONCERTS

## CONCERT ATTENDANCE

The ONLY excused absences from concerts include:

1. Excused absence from school due to field trip or extracurricular activity (with $2+$ weeks advance notice and prior approval from Mrs. Foster)
2. Illness (doctor's note required)
3. Family emergency (note from parent or guardian required)
4. Other case-by-case conflicts with 2+ weeks advance notice and prior approval from Mrs. Foster

Because of the collaborative nature of performances, scheduled concerts are required.
Students should note conflicts at the beginning of the school year and compare against athletic, extracurricular, and other scheduled activities. In cases where reconciling the conflict is challenging or something unexpected comes up, students should contact the director immediately (at least two weeks before the event.) Mrs. Foster is always willing to speak with coaches/sponsors and find a compromise. Students are usually welcome to stay after school for concerts.

Students who miss a performance will receive a $0 \%$ for a Test/Concert grade. If the absence is excused, it can be made up individually with me through a pass-off of the music that would have been performed. Students must seek out the director to receive a make-up grade. If the absence is unexcused, their make-up work will receive a maximum of $50 \%$. Students who are out of uniform receive a $50 \%$. Students who arrive late or leave early (without prior approval) receive an $80 \%$. These grades may be adjusted slightly on an individual basis at the discretion of the director.

## CONCERT ETIQUETTE

Concert Etiquette is an important skill for music students and families. It allows others to enjoy the music without distraction! We also record the concerts, so please help us get the best recording possible. Please do the following at all concerts:

- Turn off phone, or set it to vibrate.
- Make sure the shutter sound and flash are off for any photos.
- Stay quiet so everyone can listen to each piece.
- Stay in your seat while the Band is playing. If you need to leave, wait until the piece is over.
- Keep small children with you at all times, and take them outside if they need a break.
- Wait to clap until after the conductor lowers her hands. Silence is part of the music!
- Attend the entire concert out of respect for the efforts and dedication of the students involved.
We deeply appreciate your attendance at our concerts! You, the audience, play such an important role at concerts. As we encourage our student performers to use proper concert etiquette, please remember how important it is for parents, friends, adults, and older siblings to model that behavior. Thank you for positively reinforcing appropriate concert etiquette so everyone may enjoy the performance.


## UNIFORMS

Uniform for concerts/performances will be the WHMS Band polo (covered by Band fees,) khaki pants, long black socks (that cover the entire ankle,) and all-black shoes. Please go ahead and begin to purchase these items well before the first concert!

## INSTRUMENTS

## SCHOOL-OWNED INSTRUMENTS AND REPAIRS

Some school-owned instruments may be lent ONLY to students whose financial situation does not allow them to rent their own, or whose instrument is not able to be rented from a music store. These may include baritone/euphonium, tuba, French horn, tenor or bari saxophone, oboe, bassoon, bass clarinet, and some percussion. All other students are expected to rent or buy their own instruments. Follow Mrs. Foster's recommendations closely to avoid instruments that are in poor condition, which can cause difficulty playing, extra maintenance and repair costs, or loss of instrument entirely.

Students are expected to maintain and clean instruments regularly. (For school-owned instruments, nominal repair charges due to normal wear and tear will be covered by the rental fee.) Loss or damage due to negligence of a West Hall-owned instrument is the responsibility of the student/family. Rental instruments are on a first come, first served basis.

Repairs of student-owned instruments are the responsibility of the student and family. Repairs of school-owned instruments are generally the responsibility of the Band. However, the school does not cover repairs due to negligence, such as horseplay or failure to properly maintain an instrument.

If a student would like their personal instrument repaired by Music and Arts, a trusted repair shop, they make frequent visits to the school. Students should leave their instrument with Ms. Foster with their name clearly marked and a note inside describing the damage/issue and contact info. Mr. Kilpatrick will give an estimate and get the parents' approval before doing any work on the instrument that would cost money.

## PERCUSSION INSTRUMENTS

Percussionists are responsible for setup, tear-down, and appropriate care and storage of all percussion instruments. Percussionists may utilize school instruments at any time for practice before, during, or after school with permission. They may also take them home with Mrs. Foster's approval.

Percussion instruments are to be played or touched only by percussionists. Should a non-percussionist touch or move a percussion instrument, following a warning, disciplinary action will be pursued.

## CHARMS

The West Hall Band Program utilizes an online database called Charms Office Assistant. This helps with communication, management, and organization of all things related to the West Hall Band Program. Charms not only keeps track of inventory records, fundraising profits, and member information, it is also a tool for our student musicians. They can keep practice logs online, upload playing tests, and more.

## How do I login as a Parent/Student

- Log on to www.charmsoffice.com and click "Parents/Students/Members Log in" in the upper right corner.
- Locate the "Parent/Student/Members Login" section of the web page. Login to your student's account using the school code: westhallmsband
- This will bring up the main "Public" page. This will allow you to look at the calendar for the West Hall Band including event list, and handouts and other "publicly shared" files, as well as a few other options.
- If this is your first time accessing Charms, you will need to enter your student's school ID number. Once you access Charms using the school ID, you can create another password. Remember to create a password that the whole family can remember, and write it down!
- If the student or parent has already accessed the Charms account, you will need to use the password initially created by the first person to login.


## I am unable to $\log$ in. What do I do?

- If you do not know or forgot your password, there are mechanisms to recover/reset a lost username or password. Click "forgot password" and input the email associated with your account.
- A reset link will be sent to the email address you signed up with. This may take up to 24 hours. If the email still does not come through, contact Mrs. Foster.


## How do I update my personal information?

- Click on "Update Info" (blue person logo)
- You can help make changes to adult and student information page (such as updating phone numbers and email addresses if they
 change) to help them communicate with you more effectively. Click Update Info to save changes.

How can I make payments online through Charms?

- This function is coming, hopefully by the 2023-24 school year! We must establish a strong parent organization and Booster Board first. For now, please make payments directly to Mrs. Foster with cash or check (made out to WHMS
band) in a labeled envelope.


## JOIN REMIND

Join our Remind group to stay up to date on all Band updates. All students under 13 who join will have certain restrictions.


# 11 <br> WHMBANDS HELPFUL OPPORTUNITIES 

## FAMILY INVOLVEMENT

Here are a few things parents/guardians can do to help:

- Join the WHMS Band Association.
- If you ever have a question, consult the handbook or calendar. If you're still not sure, ask Ms. Foster!
- Volunteer to chaperone field trips and events.
- Show an interest in the musical study of your child.
- Take personal instruments to the shop once a year for maintenance.
- Be extra-careful with instruments. Repairs cost money!
- Keep their case stocked with all accessories needed (Saxophones and clarinets need 3 or more reeds at a time.)
- Purchase a metronome and tuner. (Phone apps are perfectly fine.)
- Find a quiet place where your child can practice without interruption.
- Come up with a reward system for DAILY practice.
- Provide private lessons! Ms. Foster will help you find a great professional teacher, or join our Mentor Lesson Program and we will find them an older student who plays their instrument.
- Make faithful attendance at all Band activities.
- Stay current on your "fair share" of fundraisers and fees.
- Help your child remember to use their agenda for marking important dates.
- Teach your child to be prepared and on time to each rehearsal or lesson.
- Notify the director if your child will be absent from any events.
- Keep the Handbook in a safe place and refer to it often.
- Put the Band Calendar on the fridge, or somewhere prominent.


## STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Learning leadership skills is an important part of band. Officers (music librarians, section leaders, equipment managers, and others as deemed necessary) may be chosen to serve in leadership capacities for a day, a week, or for the school year. Student leaders will serve the program at the discretion of Ms. Foster. They may have extra responsibilities in and outside of class, such as morning meetings during RIGOR time.

## PRIVATE LESSONS

Private lessons on a musical instrument are the best way to improve performance skills. The one-on-one approach allows the student to benefit from individual
attention as opposed to a teacher monitoring a class of over forty. A recent survey of students in the S.C. All-State Band revealed that approximately $85 \%$ of the students in the honor Band studied privately. Mrs. Foster will be more than happy to assist in the selection of a private teacher, including virtual lessons! We also have a Mentor Lesson Program from October to early April that allows high school band students to mentor a middle school band student who plays their same instrument.

## AUDITIONS AND HONOR BANDS

Members of the Band program are eligible to audition for the All-State and All-District Honor Bands. 6th graders/beginners have an additional opportunity to attend First Year Honor Band with no audition and are nominated by their director. Being selected for these ensembles is an honor and participating will be a memorable and musically rich experience. Please consult the Band calendar, the GMEA All State honor band website, and ask Mrs. Foster for more information.

## SPARTAN SOUND - PEP BAND

Here at West Hall, we like to show our support for all of our students through music. On a completely volunteer basis, 7th and 8th graders have the opportunity to learn some pop songs and play them with high school band students at a few football and basketball games each year! We will know more specific dates once the county finalizes their athletic schedule, but generally, football games are Tuesday nights, and basketball games are Monday and Thursday nights. Students will also have opportunities to play at curriculum nights, pep rallies, 5th grade visits, and more. The uniform for any Pep Band activity is any West Hall spirit wear shirt and jeans. Audition information for Spartan Sound will be released in early October. Auditions and the release of the Spartan Sound roster will occur in November before Thanksgiving break.

## FINANCES

In order to keep Band accessible to all students, we expect every member to participate in fundraisers and contribute a Band Fee. Fundraising supports clinicians, instruments, music, and so many other opportunities. Making small incremental payments is acceptable, just make sure to communicate with Mrs. Foster. Families in financial situations that make paying Band Fees an impossibility should speak to Mrs. Foster directly for alternatives. Families who do not wish to participate in fundraisers are welcome to donate the $\$ 100$ fundraising expectation instead.

We, members of the West Hall Middle School Band, agree to work together to stop bullying at our school. Everyone has the right to feel physically and emotionally safe here. We will do everything we can as members of the school's largest organization to create a safe environment.

Bullying is defined as intentional aggressive behavior that can take many forms (verbal, physical, direct, indirect, and cyber bullying). Bullying can be one person bullying another, a group of people ganging up against one person, or one group of people targeting another group.

Some examples of bullying include:

- Spreading rumors, or posting degrading, or harmful pictures, messages, or information using social media/internet.
- Name calling, joking, or making offensive remarks about a person's religion, gender, ethnicity, special needs, or socioeconomic status.
- Physical acts of bullying, such as punching, slapping, or tripping someone.

I agree to:

- Treat other members with kindness and respect.
- Not engage in verbal, physical or cyber bullying.
- Abide by the school's anti-bullying policies and procedures.
- Support the students who have been victimized by bullies.
- Speak out against bullying.
- Notify a parent, teacher, or staff member when bullying does occur.
- Be a role model for other students.

I understand that bullying of any form will result in the following disciplinary actions depending on the severity of the offense:

- 1st offense: Individual verbal warning and Step, potential conference with parent
- 2nd offense: Write up
- 3rd offense: Write up and disciplinary action such as removal from sectionals
- 3+ offenses or extreme behavior: Expulsion from the program at the discretion of the director.
